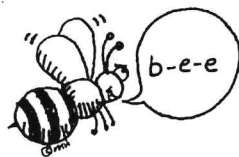
R.E

In R.E the children will be learning about the creation story and the order in which God created the world. They will also be learning about various stages in life such as Christenings, education work and marriage.



English

There will be a big focus on spelling this term. The children will be supported to learn spelling patterns and techniques to develop and improve their spelling further. The children will be taught ways to extend their writing when writing stories and non-fiction texts. The children's phonics test will also be taking place this term in the week beginning 11th June.



Maths

During the Summer Term the children will be developing their multiplication and division skills. The children will be learning how to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. They will use their multiplication and division skills to solve problems. They will also be learning how to measure lengths, heights and weights in standard units. The children will also be learning how to write and spell number names to 20.



P.E

We will be having P.E on a Tuesday and a Wednesday. Please make sure that your child's labelled P.E Kit is in school at all times.

This term the children will be taking part in orienteering and games.



Bright Lights Big City

Our topic for this half term is 'Bright Lights Big City'. The topic focuses on our capital city London and the Royal

Family. The children will learn all the Queen her role and her family. Exploring her homes and their location. They will also look at famous London landmarks and enhance their mapping skills by finding their location on a London map. They will be investigating the 'Fire of London' how this began, what caused this and the results of this great event. We will also be exploring a topic called 'Memory Box' which explores themselves and their family.



Homework

The children's reading books will be changed three times a week on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. It is important that you read regularly with your child and keep your reading record updated. Homework (Learning Log and Maths book) will go out on a Friday and should be back in school by Thursday.
