

## RE Home Learning

### Week 1

Read the story of Noah from Genesis 6:5–9:17. [https://biblestories.org/the\\_great\\_flood](https://biblestories.org/the_great_flood)

Choose your favourite and least favourite moments. Did it make you think of any puzzling questions? Were there any surprises? What are your feelings about characters and events?

List a) the qualities Noah had that made God choose him, and b) the actions Noah carries out in obedience to God's commands.

Create a piece of artwork about the story of Noah.

### Week 2

Define a 'pact'

When God gives rules in the Noah story (Chapter 9), he makes a covenant — a pact. Lots of people make promises including Brownies, doctors, policemen, parents at christenings, explain the types of promises they make. Can you think of any more people that make promises?

Write a family contract: on a large piece of paper write down your promises you will do to help your family.

### Week 3

There are many symbols in a Christian wedding, these include the wedding dress, prayers and readings from the Bible, lighting of candles, and exchanging of vows and rings.

Research the symbolism of each of the things that happens at a Christian wedding. Draw a picture of each of the symbols and explain what each of the symbols mean.

### Week 4

Read Genesis 12:1 – 12:9 [https://biblestories.org/god\\_calls\\_abraham](https://biblestories.org/god_calls_abraham)

What was Abraham asked to leave behind and where was he asked to go?

Create a comic strip to explain key moments in the story try to include Abraham's thoughts and feelings in your comic strip.

### Week 5

Some Christians are inspired to have faith like Abraham and follow God: for example, members of the Salvation Army. Research William Booth then create a Powerpoint or an information booklet to tell the story of how he founded the Christian Mission and then the Salvation Army.
