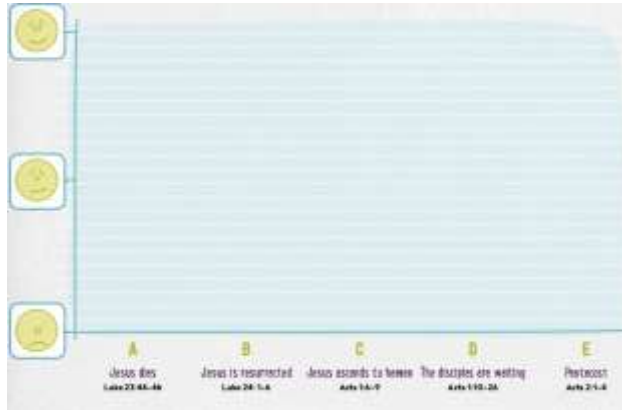
Week 1

Read The Day of Pentecost: Acts 2: 1–15, 22 and 37–41.

Write down the six key events in the story. Decide and explain when the disciples were scared, confused, excited, relieved, amazed, fearful, mystified, and so on.

Week 2

Pentecost is the Church's birthday. Suggest ways in which Christians should celebrate this birthday — the giving of the Holy Spirit. List some activities Christians might do and say; where would this be, and why. Think about ways of capturing the excitement of that first Pentecost with sound (what sounds might you hear, what hymns might you sing), movement, colour (what colours will you see at the celebration), and so on.

Week 3

Design, then create a banner to hang in a church at the festival of Pentecost. Include: the story, the symbols, the big ideas, the images and the work of the church. Show what Christians should do as a result of believing in the Holy Spirit.

Week 4

Look at the words of the Lord's Prayer: what clues does that give to what Christians might believe the Kingdom of God should be like?

Link the ideas and explanations to the lines of the prayer. From Jesus' prayer, what do Christians think the Kingdom of God is like?

St George's Day 23rd April	Create presentation about St Georges Day. Include the following information: Who is St George? How did he become a Saint? Why do we celebrate St Georges day? What celebrations take place? When do they take place?
Start of Ramadan 24th April	<p>Ramadan is a very important time for Muslims; Ramadan is celebrated all over the world. Ramadan is a time for Muslims to pray (salat) more than normal. It is also a time of fasting. Fasting is one of the Five Pillars or duties of Islam. By fasting, Muslims can focus instead on other aspects of living such as being kind to others. Muslims believe that Muhammad was very generous and kind; especially so during Ramadan.
